WATER CONSERVATION CUSTOMER REBATE PROGRAM

The FY 2018 budget allocated \$3,200 for Triunfo Sanitation District's (TSD's) participation in the Metropolitan Water District (MWD) conservation rebate program for fiscal year 2017-2018. This allocation funds supplemental customer rebates for high-efficiency clothes washers, high-efficiency toilets, weather-based irrigation controllers, and rain barrels.

From July 1, 2017 through February 14, 2018, MWD reported OPWS customer rebate payments for 24 high-efficiency clothes washers, 4 high-efficiency toilets, and 13 weather-based irrigation controllers. There have been no rebate applications submitted for rain barrels.

TSD's allocation status as of February 14, 2018 is as follows:

On January 24, 2018, staff attended the Conservation Coordinator/PIO Meeting at the Calleguas Municipal Water District headquarters. Mr. Eric Berg of Calleguas MWD made a presentation on the current and forecasted water supply, legislative updates, and outreach & conservation activities. In support of conservation efforts, print media advertisements for the rebate program were purchased from the Acorn newspapers (Camarillo, Moorpark, Simi Valley, and Thousand Oaks/Oak Park editions) to run on February 1, February 15, March 1, and March 15. Also, additional sessions of the hands-on drip irrigation training have been scheduled; these sessions will be held in Thousand Oaks and in Oxnard, through the Master Gardeners of Ventura County. Attendee feedback from the first round of training sessions was very positive, and because of the hands-on component of the training, it was worthwhile to add training sessions rather than to increase the number of participants per session. 
Webb-Cole of Metropolitan Water District provided an update on proposed modifications to water-use efficiency programs. One of the proposed updates includes the possibility of re-implementing a turf removal program. She emphasized that it was still in the early stages of development, and any iteration of a turf removal program would be very different from the previous program.
